In this regard the Addl.DGF (Wildlife) has already requested the Surveyor General, Survey of India for the needful, and a copy of the above letter is appended for ready reference.
3. The spear-head teams receiving training in the regional workshops may please be allowed to carry out capacity building of other field staff in the State, keeping in mind the schedule for field data collection. This Ministry may please be apprised of action taken in this regard including details of field level workshops to be convened.
4. Due economy should be exercised in conducting the estimation keeping in mind the expenditure management drive.
5. No permanent staff should be recruited and the contract labour to be deployed will be kept to the minimum necessary for estimation.
6. It may be ensured that the additional labour and personnel to be deployed do not have any claim to permanent government service, and their tenure may be kept to the minimum necessary duration.
7. The itinerary of national / international peers, who would be overseeing the data collection, would be communicated in due course of time. The Utilisation Certificate pertaining to the Central Assistance provided may please be furnished to this Ministry in the prescribed format after completion of the work.
