Sub: Centrally Sponsored Planned Scheme 'Project Tiger' – Administrative approval for Central Assistance release to Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, Madhya Pradesh during 2008-09 – Enhancement of scheme - regarding.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the administrative approval of the competent authority to the enhancement of the Scheme from Rs. 3190.99 lakhs (Rupees Three thousand one hundred ninety lakhs and ninety nine thousand only) to Rs. 3279.93 lakhs (Rupees Three thousand two hundred seventy nine lakhs and ninety three thousand only) in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, Madhya Pradesh during the year 2008-09. The enhancement of amount of Rs. 88.94 lakh (Rupees Eighty eight lakhs and ninety four thousand only) has been sanctioned under Non-recurring and Recurring activities as given in Annexure-I as additional allocation for the year 2008-09.

2. I am also directed to convey the sanction of the competent authority to the release of an amount of Rs. 73.42 lakhs (Rupees Seventy three lakhs and forty two thousand only) to Government of Madhya Pradesh during the current financial year 2008-09.

3. The terms and conditions governing the above release are the same as given in paras 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of the sanction letter of even number dated 20th August, 2008.

4. The payment sanctioned above is provisional and is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the audited figures of expenditure. Other terms and conditions of the payment are as under:

- a) The grant is in accordance with the pattern of financial assistance approved by the Planning Commission and the Ministry of Finance.
- b) The grant sanctioned is subject to the adjustment on basis of the terms and conditions approving the scheme.

5. No deviation from the approved items of expenditure as enumerated in the annexure shall be made without prior concurrence of the Government of India. The guidelines for implementation of Project Tiger shall be fully adhered to. The Chief Wildlife warden and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of the State Government should be directed to ensure that the field works are in accordance with the Management plan and the Annual Plan of operation by the field inspections from time to time.

6. In accordance with the revised procedure, the Central Account Section, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur, may kindly be advised to pass credit to the books of the State Government of Madhya Pradesh under intimation to this Ministry.

7. The expenditure involved will be met from within the Sanctioned Budget Grants of Centrally Sponsored Project tiger Scheme under Demand No. 29, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Major Head 3601 – Grants-in-aid to the State Governments, 3601.04- Grants-in-aid for Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme, 3601.04.659-Environmental Forestry and Wildlife – Wildlife Preservation, 3601.04.659.03- Project tiger, 3601.04.659.03.00.31- Grants-in-aid for the year 2008-09 (Plan).

8. This issues under the powers delegated to the Ministry and with the concurrence of Integrated Finance Division vide Dy. No. 77/JS&FA/F/09 dated 14.1.2009.
