Sub: Administrative Approval for funds release for 2nd All India Tiger Estimation using the refined methodology (Monitoring of tiger, co-predators, prey and habitats) during 2009-10.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the administrative approval of the competent authority for carrying out the 2nd All India estimation of Tiger, large carnivores, ungulate along with habitat status evaluation (2009-10) in the State **Maharashtra** at the total cost of **8.33 lakhs** (Rupees Eight lakhs and Thirty Three thousand only). The cost of the scheme will be treated as 100% Central Assistance by the Government of India.

2. I am also directed to convey the sanction of the competent authority to the release of an amount of **5.64 lakhs** (Rupees Five lakhs and Sixty Four thousand only) to Government of Maharashtra.

3. The payment sanctioned above is provisional and is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the audited figures of expenditure. Other terms and conditions of the payment are as under:

a) The grant is in accordance with the pattern of financial assistance approved by the Planning Commission and the Ministry of Finance.

b) The grant sanctioned is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the terms and conditions approving the scheme.

4. No deviation from the approved items of expenditure as enumerated in the annexure shall be made without prior concurrence of the Government of India. The Chief Wildlife warden and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of the State Government are required to ensure that the estimation of tiger, wild animals and habitat evaluation works are in accordance with the directives issued by the National Tiger Conservation Authority/Project Tiger Division of the Ministry of Environment & Forests.

5. In accordance with the revised procedure, the Central Accounts Section, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur, may kindly be advised to pass on credit to the books of the **State Government of Maharashtra** under intimation to this Department.

6. The expenditure involved will be met from within the Sanctioned Budget Grants of Centrally Sponsored Project tiger Scheme under Demand No. 29, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Major Head 3601 – Grants-in-aid to the State Governments, 3601.04- Grants-in-aid for Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme, 3601.04.659-Environmental Forestry and Wildlife – Wildlife Preservation, 3601.04.659.03- Project tiger, 3601.04.659.03.00.31- Grants-in-aid for the year 2009-10 (Plan).

7. This issues with the concurrence of the Forest Finance Division of the Department vide their Dy. No. 886/Dir(IFD) dated 16.2.2010 under the powers delegated to the Ministries/Departments.
