Subject: Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme "Project Tiger"- Administrative Approval for funds release **Bandipur Tiger Reserve** including **Nagarhole (Rajiv Gandhi) National Park Karnataka** during 2004 – 2005.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the administrative approval of the competent authority to the continuance of the Scheme 'Project Tiger' during 2004-2005 in **Bandipur Tiger Reserve** including **Nagarhole (Rajiv Gandhi) National Park Karnataka** at the cost of Rs. 625.13 lakhs (Rupees six hundred twenty five lakhs and thirteen thousand only) as per details given in the annexure. Of the total cost of the scheme, Rs. 248.54 lakhs (Rupees two hundred forty eight lakhs and fifty four thousand only) being the recurring cost of scheme will be shared on 50:50 basis by the Government of India and the Government of Karnataka. The remaining cost of Rs. 376.59 lakhs (Rupees three hundred seventy six lakhs and fifty nine thousand only) being the non-recurring cost of the scheme will be treated as 100% Central Assistance by the Government of India.

2. I am also directed to convey the sanction of the Competent Authority to the release of an amount of Rs. 150.00 Lakhs (Rupees one hundred fifty lakhs only) to Government of Karnataka towards the Ist installments of the Central Share of Assistance during the current financial year 2004-2005. The balance amount of the Central Assistance will be released in due course after a review of the progress of expenditure / work is undertaken.

3. The payment sanctioned above is provisional and is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the audited figures of expenditure. Other terms and conditions of the payment are as under:

- a) The grant is in accordance with the pattern of financial assistance approved by the Planning Commission and the Ministry of Finance.
- b) The grant sanctioned is subject to the adjustment on the basis of the terms and conditions approving the scheme.

4. No deviation from the approved items of expenditure as enumerated in the annexure shall be made without prior concurrence of the Government of India. The guidelines for implementation of Project Tiger shall be fully adhered to. The Chief Wildlife Warden and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests of the State Government should be directed to

ensure that the field works are in accordance with the Management plan and the Annual Plan of Operation by the field inspections from time to time.

5. In accordance with the revised procedure, the Central Accounts Section, Reserve Bank of India, Nagpur, may kindly be advised to pass on credit to the books of the State Government of Karnataka under intimation to this Ministry.

6. The expenditure involved is debitable to the Major Head '3601'-Grants in aid to State Governments. 3601.04-Grants for Centrally Sponsored Plan Scheme .3601.04.659-Environmental Forestry and Wildlife -Wildlife Preservation 3601.04.659.03. Project Tiger 3601.04.659.03.00.31 Grants in aid under demand No. 29 of the Ministry of Environment and Forests (Plan) for the year 2004-05.

7. This issues with the concurrence of the Finance Division of the Department vide their Dy. No. 1227/JS&FA/F/2004 dated 16.8.2004 under the powers delegated to the Ministries/Departments.
